## LANDLORD'S RIGHTS

The Residential Tenancies Act regulates every residential landlord and tenants renting a residential property in the province of Ontario. There are responsibilities and rights for landlords. ### ATTENTION GARDENERS!

There is hardly a gardener out there who hasn't encountered a Japanese beetle. The adult Japanese beetle is a shiny, metallic green with copper-brown wing covers and it's about 3/8-inch in length. Not all metallic green or copper beetles are Japanese Beetles To be sure of what you're dealing with, you can look closely at the underside of the beetle and you'll also see 5 small, white tufts under the wing covers and an additional tuft at the end of the abdomen.

Japanese beetles can create havoc in a garden by feeding on the leaves of a number of different plants, skeletonizing the leaves and eventually defoliating the plants. An individual Japanese beetle doesn't do that much damage while feeding on a plant, but they tend to congregate in large numbers and can easily defoliate shrubs and trees. Keep in mind that the adult Japanese beetles are only around for a little over a month. So don't automatically reach for the sprayer unless they become a serious problem.

# HOW TO CONTROL?

It's impossible to get rid of Japanese beetles entirely. More will fly in as the current crops are killed.

- Go into your garden with a jar of soap water and knock the beetles into it. Japanese beetles feed in groups, starting at the top of plants, so it's actually pretty easy to fill a jar with them.
-Insecticidal soap will kill adult Japanese beetles only if it is sprayed directly on the beetle. It does not have any residual effect, meaning that beetles that aren't sprayed directly won't be harmed.



### **CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP**

#### Age & Language factors

Many of the new immigrants who wanted to become Canadian Citizens are getting mixed messages through ethnic medias. The applicants between the ages of 18 to 64 are still need to fulfill the language requirement of Level 4.

The others over the age of 64 are exempt from language requirements. The government of Canada is in the process of bringing down the age limit to 54, so that anyone who is over the age of 54 will be exempt from the language requirement when it becomes law. The applicants for Canadian citizenship are required to fulfill other requirements as well. The one of the important requirement is the number of days the applicant must be physically present in Canada.

The Permanent Residents are required to be physically present in Canada at least 1460 days during the six years immediately before the application and at least 183 days during each of four calendar years that are fully or partially within the six years before the application date.

While applicants who are waived from meeting the knowledge of Canada and language requirements, they must still be scheduled to appear for an interview as they must meet other requirements under the Citizenship Act.

## **SUPER VISAS- GOOD AND BAD**

### Two year Super Visa turned to Six month Visa upon entry!

Luxmy - a mother of a Canadian Citizen, who recently arrived on a Super Visa to Canada from her native Sri Lanka, was in shock when the Canadian Immigration officials allowed her to enter on a Six month Visa.

Luxmy is an English teacher from Sri Lanka, happy to receive her 9 years of multiple entries Super Visa from the Canadian high commission in her native country. Upon landing in Canada, the Canadian immigration officials asked for her medical insurance coverage.

Since, Luxmy was unable to produce a copy of her medical insurance coverage, The immigration officer changed her two-year permission to stay in Canada into just a six months visa.

But, Luxmy insists that She submitted all her papers to the Canadian Visa post overseas including her Medical insurance papers.

She failed to bring the proof for her Medical insurance coverage along with her to Canada. "I thought my Canadian visa is in order and I am free to fly with the Canadian Visa on my passport" she explained. Upon landing at the airport the copy of the medical insurance is necessary to regularise her entry into Canada with a two years of stay.

Super Visa is a Temporary Visa only for Parents and Grand Parents who are willing to come and visit their children or grand children in Canada. The sponsors of such visas are required to give supporting documents, along with a letter of invitation.

The medical insurance is a must for granting such visas as well. A copy of such medical coverage for Super Visa applicants is a must to show document for such visitors.

Apart from the application process for Super Visa, the Medical Insurance coverage needed to be established by the visitor at the time of entry into Canada. Many visitors have failed to get this advice before departure from their home countries.
